Fort St John Hospital is a state-of-the-art 55 bed hospital and 123 bed residential care facility serving a population of approximately 23,000 and is one of two area Emergency Rooms serving a catchment area of approximately 70,000.

This position is a blend of office-based consulting pediatric practice and provision of on-call coverage to the hospital. Payment is fee-for-service. The successful candidate will join one other Pediatrician in Fort St. John. The successful applicant can establish their own private practice or join an existing medical practice. Hospital duties include consultation to the emergency department, stabilizing critically ill pediatric and neonatal patients prior to transfer to larger centres, providing phone advice to primary care providers in neighboring (more rural) communities and attending newborn deliveries when requested. Infants of up to 36 weeks gestation are delivered in Fort St John.

In the Northern Health region there are opportunities for pediatricians interested in specialized work (such as Complex Developmental / Behavioral Conditions and Autism assessments). In addition, there is the potential for visiting general pediatric clinics in more rural communities. The Fort St John Child Development Centre serves children with special needs and is staffed by pediatric occupational therapists, physiotherapists and speech language therapists. There are community-based mental health services for children and youth. A Foundry Centre is planned for Fort St John; Foundry provides medical and mental health services for youth aged 12 to 26 years.

Collaboration with and onboarding support from pediatricians in other Northern Health communities is available, if desired, as the pediatricians from across the Northern Health region are well connected. There are numerous opportunities for physicians to become leaders, to pursue clinical research and/or to develop Quality Improvement initiatives within Northern Health, and there is the infrastructure to support this. There is a generous continuing medical education allowance from Northern Health, in addition to that provided by Doctors of BC.

Fort St John is the regional hub for the Northeast region and is a teaching site for University of British Columbia (UBC) Medicine. Teaching of medical learners is expected, including UBC Family Medicine Residents and medical students. The successful applicant will be eligible for a UBC Medicine Clinical Faculty appointment in Pediatrics.

New affordable housing is plentiful in Fort St John (apartments, townhomes, condos, duplexes, and single family homes) for rental or for purchase. Fort St John Regional Airport offers numerous daily flights to Vancouver and Calgary on Air Canada and WestJet. Fort St. John has seven elementary schools, two middle schools, one high school, and one private school (K-12). Northern Lights College and the University of Northern British Columbia provide post-secondary education.

The region's main industries are agriculture, forestry, natural gas, construction, and transportation.

The successful candidate would be joining a collegial group of 3 Pediatricians who work out of the Park Avenue Medical Clinic. This position would be responsible for office work and hospital on call (1 in 4). Terrace is the referral center for the NW central corridor, the Hazeltons and the Bulkley Valley in the Northwest Region. Hospital duties will include consultation to the emergency department, care of pediatric inpatients, high-risk stabilization, and care of newborns prior to transfer to larger centers if indicated. Teaching to family practice residents and 3rd and 4th year medical students will be expected periodically. You would be fully supported by a team of specialist colleagues including Anaesthesia, General Surgery, Plastic Surgery, General Internal Medicine and Critical Care, Psychiatry and Pediatrics.

Call includes taking phone calls from neighboring communities, stabilizing newborns before transport - we aim for above 34 weeks, stabilizing complex pediatric patients before transport, and managing stable inpatients.

Mills Memorial Hospital (MMH) is a 44 bed, acute care facility, with an average of 24,700 ER visits per year. MMH serves as the referral center for the Pacific Northwest of British Columbia. The state of the art, 560 million dollars new site will be completed by the end of 2024 affording expanded logistics, space, a NICU and integrated trauma and elective service delivery potential.

Mills Memorial Hospital has 24/7 XR and CT scanning, weekday MRI, weekday formal U/S, and a POCUS in the Emergency Department. The 5 bed ICU is adjacent to the ED providing easy access to IM/ ICU Physicians.

Smithers is located in the picturesque Bulkley Valley surrounded by three mountain ranges which provide a backdrop for the town's Alpine setting. The main industries include forestry, tourism, transportation and agriculture. Smithers offers affordable housing and natural splendor that support a balanced lifestyle. The population of Smithers is approximately 6,000, with an additional 5,000 from the surrounding communities that access services. There are three elementary schools, one secondary school, one alternate format school for grades 9-12 and Coast Mountain College.

The average cost of a home in Smithers sits at \$587,000, with both urban and rural real estate close to the water and mountains.

Terrace's main industry drivers include forestry, agriculture, tourism and mining. Also known as the "Gateway to the North", Terrace offers a regional airport for ease of travel around the region and direct flights to Vancouver.

Terrace is situated on the traditional territory of the "**Wet'suwet'en**" people. Wet'suwet'en means "People of the lower hills". Their territory extends from the village of Hagwilget in the New Hazelton area in the west to Burns Lake in the east. From Moricetown in the north it stretches to the Ootsa Lake area in the south.
